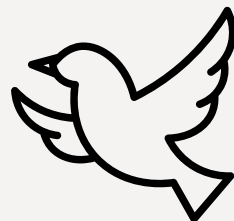

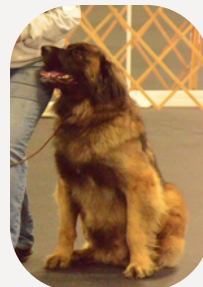

Family Membership will now be \$150

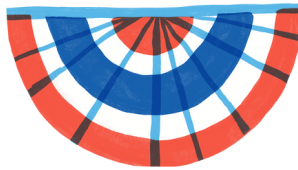
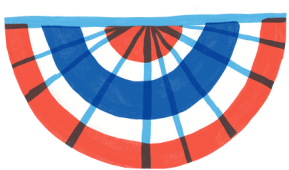


FASTCAT HELP!

UPDATE LOYAL STAY STUDY

Gypsy has been in the Loyal Stay Study for over a year now! The Study test the effectiveness of the drug LOY-002 to extend the lifespan of dogs, while preserving their quality of life compared to a similar flavored tablet without the study medication in it. (a placebo). This study involves studying dogs over an extended period of time and monitoring how long they live. Because of this, the study will be approximately 4-5 years long. We are currently in the phase where we go to a Stay Study appointment every 6 months. At the appointment, they examine Gypsy and collect blood and urine samples. Basically a Geriatric profile is completed. The Stay Study drugs (or placebo) is shipped to our home automatically once we complete the appointment. The number of participants has recently increased from 1000 to 1300 dogs. The drug controls metabolic syndrome in older dogs. I understand there are also equivalent drugs for humans already on the market but don't know any more then that. There is a youtube video on the Veterinarian Roundtable with Dr. Ellen Ratcliff called "Can we help dogs live longer" that is very interesting to watch.

On May 10, 2025, Team Gracie earned the final qualifying score needed to finish her Scent Work Master Buried Elite Title which also finished her Scent Work Master Elite Title. To earn her Master Elite Title, she needed ten qualifying scores in Master Buried, Master Container, Master Exterior, and Master Interior. Gracie is only the sixth English Cocker Spaniel to earn the Scent Work Master Elite Title. Since Team Gracie had already earned the Novice Elite, Advanced Elite, and Excellent Elite Titles, along with her Master Elite Title, scent work people have labeled this the "Super Elite Title" (not recognized by the AKC). One hundred sixty qualifying scores. We are only the second English Cocker Spaniel team to earn this title. I am very proud of her! She now joins my girl Lily in adding SWME after her name.

May was a busy month. Gracie and Lily went to a C-Wags trial on May 6th. Gracie earned her Detective, Level 2 Title and her Ranger 2 Title. Lily earned her Scent Investigator, Level 3 Title. Gracie also picked up a Time 2 Beat Q at the Cleveland Agility Trial.

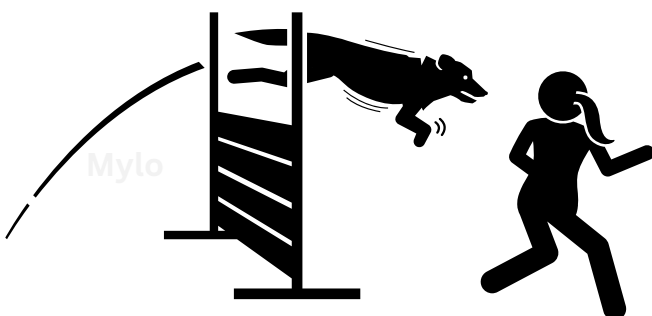
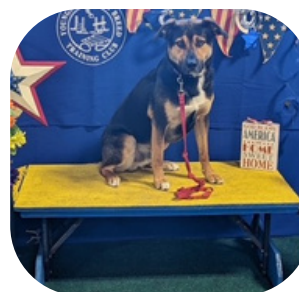

Signs of Heat Stroke & Dangerous Vehicle Temperatures

Pets can suffer from heat stroke just like humans. Extreme temperatures and lack of available water as well as being left in a hot car, can quickly lead to heat stroke and even death. HOT WEATHER SAFETY TIPS FOR PET OWNERS



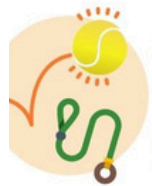
TIP 1: PROVIDE LOTS OF WATER

Give your pets plenty of fresh, clean water.



TIP 3: BRING PETS INSIDE

Avoid extreme heat and heat related illnesses like heat stroke and heat exhaustion by bringing pets indoors.



TIP 2: EXERCISE DURING COOLER TEMPERATURES

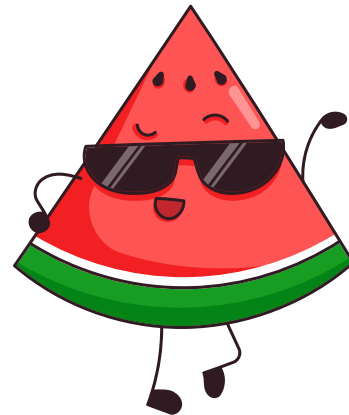
Don't exercise your pets in high temperatures or when the pavement is hot.



TIP 4: NEVER LEAVE A PET IN A PARKED CAR

Never leave a pet in a parked car, even for a short time. On a mild 80-degree day, the temperature inside a car can reach 100 degrees in less than 10 minutes and can be fatal.
